Overview of the project	The general objective of the project is to contribute to the sustainable improvement of the employability of women, young people, returnees and the development of the mango sector in the <i>Cascades, Hauts Bassins</i> and Centre regions of Burkina Faso. The project implements actions such as training and socio-professional integration of women, young people, and returnees through dual vocational training modules (classroom and workplace based training). It also promotes entrepreneurship in women and young people through training in entrepreneurial skills and the allocation of start-up kits for self-employment. The Franco-Burkinabe partnership between chambers of commerce and industry and chambers of trades and crafts promoted by this project helps to build business relations between the two countries and to strengthen skills through the new innovative services offered by business support organisations. In this respect, the project is based in particular on the decentralised regional cooperation already in place between the <i>Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes</i> region in France and the <i>Hauts Bassins</i> region in Burkina Faso.
Significant project outcomes to be achieved	 600 direct beneficiaries (young people between 15 and 40 years, returnees, SMEs, private sector support organisations, training centres, employment promotion agencies) are to be made aware of the opportunities created through technical and vocational education and training (TVET) 480 young people are to participate in vocational training modules (classroom based and workplace training) and entrepreneurship training TVET specific to careers in the mango sector is to be improved in terms of training reference frameworks/curricula 100 local business leaders are to be sensitised to workplace training and apprenticeships 35 local trainers are to be trained 3 new services are to be developed within local SME support structures 3 certification schemes which are recognised by the competent authorities are to be developed
